don't let your slides replace you

Tips & tricks

don't do live coding, nobody likes it

Tips & tricks

never ask "is there someone who doesn't know X?"

don't focus on THAT person who seems bored af

Tips & tricks

actually, don't focus on anyone!

be open to constructive feedback

Tips & tricks

don't mind shitty one

Tips & tricks

you are on the stage, they are not

Tips & tricks

be humble

Tips & tricks

it's OK not to know something

Tips & tricks

don't bullshit, ever

Tips & tricks

the demo God will always be an asshole

Tips & tricks

have backup plans for your slides

Tips & tricks

always do a test run

Tips & tricks

assume you'll speak faster than during rehearsal

Tips & tricks

be present for your audience

Tips & tricks

be considerate for the next speaker

Tips & tricks

empty seats, don't worry

Tips & tricks

don't be last minute, prepare yourself

Tips & tricks

bring water

Tips & tricks

don't drink alcohol before your talk

Tips & tricks

go for the obligatory biological break before your talk

Tips & tricks

use your own computer (and clicker if you have one)

Tips & tricks

use big font for text

Tips & tricks

zoom the code in your IDE

Tips & tricks

use high quality pictures or images

Tips & tricks

the shorter the talk, the more difficult it will be

Tips & tricks

validate with your audience

Tips & tricks

learn from rock star presenters

Tips & tricks

ask them for tips, most are friendly

Tips & tricks

assume that what is easy or known by you, isn't for all

Tips & tricks

leave time for questions

Tips & tricks

there is always someone who knows more than you

Tips & tricks

maximize your efforts (reuse, record, share...)


